### **Attention Club President:**

These awards are a wonderful opportunity to recognize the work of your members this year. For ease in filling out the awards, make a clean copy of each application and distribute it to the officer who would best complete the application.

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### **GROWTH ENHANCES MEMBERSHIP (G.E.M.) AWARD PROGRAM**

The G.E.M. Program was instituted by the 1990-91 CKI Board to recognize clubs that achieve success in membership growth as compared to the previous year's statistics. The program recognizes clubs in four divisions: Ruby, Sapphire, Emerald, and Diamond. The five clubs with the highest membership growth in each category will be recognized at the Circle K International Convention.

#### **THE SPECIFICATIONS OF EACH DIVISION ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

- RUBY** - clubs with 1-19 members during previous year, but 20 or more members during current year
- SAPPHIRE** - clubs with 20-40 members during previous year
- EMERALD** - clubs with 41-60 members during previous year
- DIAMOND** - clubs with more than 61 members during previous year

A percentage increase will be computed in each division, and the five clubs with the highest percentage increase will be recognized.

**Clubs do not need to complete specific forms to participate in this program. The total dues a club pays by April 15 of each year will be the figure the International Office uses to compute the percentage of growth for that club.**

Throughout the year, clubs must forward a dues and membership form as they register and pay for new members.

The Club Achievement Award is designed to recognize and honor those Circle K clubs that have excelled in all aspects of club operation.

## GUIDELINES FOR THE COMPLETION OF THIS FORM.

1. Members reported must be in good standing as reported to the district and to Circle K International.
2. Complete the remainder of the form using club minutes; report forms sent to the district, project report forms, and other club records.
3. Use specific statements showing definite accomplishments and the month and year in which the activities were conducted.
4. State the exact extent of participation by the club, such as “cooperated,” aided,” “assisted,” etc.
5. List activities performed by the club, but not those performed by individual members on their own initiative or as members of other school or community groups.
6. In any area or question that does not apply to the individual club, please write “N/A” in the space provided. Review the award submission with the individuals listed on this application and obtain the proper signatures of certification. **Without all proper signatures, the entry will be disqualified.**
7. **PART ONE** of this award consists of point-based questions. Club members answer questions and write the point total in the space provided. Club members should total the number of points for each section and enter the overall total for **PART ONE** of the report.
8. **PART TWO** of this report should not be scored by club members. The scoring section in **PART TWO** is reserved for the judges’ use and any unauthorized markings will lead to disqualification of the award.

**PART TWO** of this award consists of essay-based questions. (Points will be subtracted if the response exceeds the number of pages indicated. Five points will be subtracted for each additional page.)

Responses to section H are limited to three sides of an 8.5 x 11” page - typed and double-spaced.

Responses to sections I are limited to one side of an 8.5 x 11” page - typed and double-spaced.

Responses to section J are limited to one side of an 8.5 x 11” page - typed and double-spaced.

Responses to section K are limited to one side of an 8.5 x 11” page - typed and double-spaced.

- Part two of the report must be typed. (See details above for length of responses. Points will be subtracted if the response exceeds the number of pages indicated.)
- Repetitious reporting of activities, fancy bindings, pictures, etc. will not be taken into consideration.

6. Total service hours for each activity shall be reported by area: planning, travel, actual project time, and follow-up. A service hour is sixty (60) minutes of work performed by a member of a CKI club on a service project approved by the club or club board of officers.
7. First, second, and third places in each division will be awarded.
8. Decisions of the judges are final, and no changes, alterations, or re-calculations will take place after the results have been certified by the contest committee members, the chairman of the contest committee, and the Circle K International Board Member of the contest.

# SINGLE SERVICE AWARD

## PHILOSOPHY

The Single Service Award is designed to recognize and honor those Circle K clubs, through dedication and unselfish efforts, producing the best single project or service during the year.

## GUIDELINES FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE AWARD FORM

1. Read the entire form carefully before beginning work on your application.
2. A qualifying single service project shall be defined as a club service project, planned, organized and produced by the Circle K club occurring on a single day or consecutive days, or recurring on different days. In the case of a recurring project, it is the same project that must be repeated for the purpose of achieving the same service goal.
3. The Single Service Award entry form should accompany the entry essay and supplemental material.
4. Review the award submission with the individuals listed on the Single Service Award Entry Form and obtain their signatures of certification. Without all proper signatures, the entry will be disqualified.
5. Present the entry to the Circle K International Convention Office no later than the posted closing time. Reports also may be mailed to the Circle K International Office, 3636 Woodview Trace, Indianapolis, Indiana, 46268-3196. Mailed entries must be received by June 15. Circle K International is not responsible for damage to or loss of mailed entries.

## RULES GOVERNING SINGLE SERVICE AWARD

1. To be eligible for this contest, clubs must be in good standing with both International and the district.
2. Only one service project may be entered by a club.
3. The entry shall be a complete document reporting all details of the project.
4. Certification of the accuracy of the information provided, by signature from the individuals listed on the entry form, must accompany the entry. Without all proper signatures, the entry will be disqualified.
5. The activity described shall cover any program of service performed between April 1, and March 31 of the current year.
6. The entry essay must be typewritten, double-spaced, on only one side of 8½" x 11" white paper and limited to 2,000 words.
7. Clubs shall compete with other clubs of similar size within three membership categories: Bronze - 35 members or less; Silver - 36 members to 60; Gold - 61 members or more.
8. A maximum of 6 items of supplemental material may be included. Examples of supplemental items include a letter, a report, a brochure, a page of pictures, or a newspaper clipping.
9. Entries will be judged based upon the following criteria:

## OUTSTANDING KIWANIS-FAMILY RELATIONS AWARD

### PHILOSOPHY

The Outstanding Kiwanis-Family Relations Award is designed to recognize and honor those Circle K clubs that have participated in activities and events to enhance Kiwanis-family relations.

### GUIDELINES FOR THE COMPLETION OF THIS AWARD FORM

1. Read the entire form carefully before beginning work on your application.
2. Describe the club's participation in the five following areas. Use one 8½" x 11" sheet of white paper, typed, 12-point font, 1" margins, on only one side, to describe participation in one area. Attach these sheets to the award form for submission.

**Kiwanis-Family Service Projects** - List and briefly describe all Kiwanis-family service projects. Indicate the club's involvement and which members of the Kiwanis-family participated.

**Key to College Program** - Explain how the club implemented this program and the results of the program.

**Kiwanis Career Contacts (KC<sup>2</sup>) Program** - List and briefly describe the extent to which the club participated in areas such as establishment of a business directory, day at the office, career mentor program, career fair, or other related programs.

**Kiwanis-Family Special Events, Conferences, and Conventions** - Describe all special events organized for the purpose of promoting Kiwanis-family relations, and the involvement of the club in each.

**Interclubs** - List and briefly describe all inter-clubs and meeting attendance with Kiwanis-family organizations other than Circle K. Indicate the level of involvement of the club, such as host, co-organizer, attendee, etc. (An inter-club requires a minimum of four Circle K members.)

3. Review the award submission with the individuals listed on the reverse side and obtain their signatures of certification. Without all proper signatures, the entry will be disqualified.
4. Present the entry to the Circle K International Convention Office no later than the posted office closing time. Reports may also be mailed to the Circle K International Office, 3636 Woodview Trace, Indianapolis, Indiana, 46268-3196. Mailed entries must be received by June 15. Circle K International is not responsible for damage to or loss of mailed entries.

### RULES GOVERNING OUTSTANDING KIWANIS-FAMILY RELATIONS AWARD

1. To be eligible for this contest, a club must be in good standing with both International and district.
2. To qualify for this award, a club must have participated in the five following areas during the year.
3. Points are earned for participation in each area. (100 possible points)

Kiwanis-Family Service Projects.....	30 points
Key to College Program.....	10 points
Kiwanis Career Contacts (KC <sup>2</sup> ) Program.....	10 points
Kiwanis-Family Special Events, Conferences, and Conventions.....	25 points
Kiwanis-Family Inter-clubs.....	25 points

4. No single event can be listed in more than one category.
5. The time frame of this award is April 1 - March 31.

6. Reported information pertaining to any one of the described areas of participation may not exceed one side of one sheet 8½' x 11" paper.
7. Certification, by signature from the individuals listed below, of the accuracy of the information must accompany the entry. Without all proper signatures, the entry will be disqualified.
8. Entries shall be judged, at Circle K International convention, by a panel consisting of at least one Kiwanis International official, one Key Club International official, and a past Circle K International President.
9. Decisions of the judges are final and no changes, alterations, or recalculations will take place after the results have been certified. A first, second, and third place winner will be honored.



## CLUB NEWSLETTER AWARD

### PHILOSOPHY

The Club Newsletter Award is designed to recognize and honor those Circle K clubs that produce a high-quality newsletter on a regular basis, providing an effective communication tool for the club and its members. The newsletter may be produced in paper or electronic form.

### GUIDELINES FOR ENTERING THIS CONTEST

1. Read the entire form carefully before submitting your entry.
2. One copy of each of four (4) issues of the newsletter must be submitted with the entry form.
3. Reviews the entry with the individuals listed on the reverse side and obtain the proper signatures of certification. Without all proper signatures, the entry will be disqualified.
4. Present the entry to the Circle K International Convention at the posted office closing time. Reports also may be mailed to the Circle K International Office, 3636 Woodview Trace, Indianapolis, Indiana, 46268-3196. Mailed entries must be received by June 15. Circle K International is not responsible for damage to or loss of mailed entries.

### RULES GOVERNING CLUB NEWSLETTER AWARD

1. To be eligible for this contest, clubs must be in good standing with both International and the district.
2. The time period covered by entered newsletters shall be from April 1 through March 31.
3. One copy of each of four (4) issues of the newsletter must be submitted with the entry form.
4. Judging of the entries shall be based on these criteria:

6. All phases of the work of the publication, except for the professional services required for printing, must have been performed by a Circle K member or members who are in good standing with the district and International. Non-Circle K members may act only in an advisory capacity.
7. Decisions of the judges are final and no changes, alterations, or recalculations will take place after the results have been certified by the contest committee members, the chairman of the contest committee, and the Circle K International Board Member of the contest.



## TRADITIONAL CLUB SCRAPBOOK AWARD

### PHILOSOPHY

The Club Scrapbook Award is designed to recognize and honor those Circle K clubs that produce a high-quality scrapbook chronicling the activities of the Circle K club.

### GUIDELINES FOR ENTERING THIS CONTEST

1. Read the entire form carefully before submitting your entry.
2. The scrapbook entry form should accompany the scrapbook.
3. Review the scrapbook entry form with the individuals listed on the reverse side and obtain the proper signatures of certification. Without all proper signatures, the entry will be disqualified.
4. Present the entry to the Circle K International Convention Office no later than the posted office closing time. Reports may also be mailed to the Circle K International Office, 3636 Woodview Trace, Indianapolis, Indiana, 46268-3196. Mailed entries must be received by June 15. Circle K International is not responsible for damage to or loss of mailed entries.

### RULES GOVERNING TRADITIONAL CLUB SCRAPBOOK AWARD

1. To be eligible for this contest, clubs must be in good standing with both International and the district.

Each category must be tabbed accordingly. The pages must also be numbered with a table of contents included at the beginning of the scrapbook.

Each category must be tabbed accordingly. The pages must also be numbered with a table of contents included at the beginning of the scrapbook.

## PHILOSOPHY

The Circle K International Oratorical contest is designed to encourage members to share their attitudes, beliefs, and experiences regarding the organization through a prepared speech. This also assists members in developing public-speaking skills while providing an inspirational and motivational message.

## GUIDELINES FOR ENTERING THIS COMPETITION

1. Return the completed entry form to the Circle K International Convention Office no later than the posted office closing time. Entry forms may also be mailed to the Circle K International Office and must be received by June 15. Circle K International is not responsible for damage to or loss of mailed entries.
2. The competition will be staged during the Circle K International Convention. The location will be published in the official convention program.
3. The first-place orator will present his/her oration during the Club Awards and Service session.

## RULES GOVERNING THE ORATORICAL COMPETITION

1. The subject of all orations shall be, “Please describe the one moment when you realized what it meant to be a Circle K member.”
2. The subject matter and the presentation must be original and completely developed by the orator. Subject matter and presentation will be weighted equally in the selection of the winners.
3. To be eligible for this competition, individuals must be Circle K members in good standing with International and their district, and members of a club in good standing with International and the district. International Officers will not be allowed to participate in this contest.
4. Each orator will be allowed a maximum of seven minutes for the presentation. No more than two of the seven minutes available can be used for presenting quotations.
5. Each orator must submit a complete manuscript of the oration, in English, prior to judging.
6. Each orator may use notes on index cards, no larger than 5” x 7”, only.
7. Judging and awarding points will be based on the following criteria:

**Speech – 75 Points**

Clarity of message & projection of idea.....	20 Points
Depth.....	10 Points
Originality.....	10 Points
Organization.....	20 Points
Reference.....	5 Points
Grammar/word choice.....	10 Points

**Delivery – 25 Points**

Posture (composure and gestures).....	10 Points
Voice (tone, effectiveness/pronunciation).....	10 Points
Attention of audience.....	5 Points

8. First, second and third place shall be awarded.
